

# CALCASIEU SOCCER

## 9U / 10U ACADEMY PROGRAM



**PARTICIPANTS:** The Academy is open to boys and girls in the 9U & U10 age group.

**COACHING:** Licensed CSC coaches/trainers will be assigned to each team

**VENUE:** Practices will take place at the Ward 3 Power Center Complex in Lake Charles

**UNIFORM:** The CSC Recreation uniform for games and CSC Eagles shirt (provided) for practice.

**PRACTICE:** Two 90-minute practice sessions per week

**COMPETITION:** Games with partner clubs, home & away, 2 tournaments (approx. 1 hr. travel).

### **DATES & DURATION:**

- 20 weeks (10 weeks Fall / 10 weeks Spring)
- FALL - August through October / SPRING - February through April

**COST:** \$550 total. Payments go towards coach payment, practice shirts, event entry fees.

Options to pay:

1. **Three Installments:** \$200 (at time of registration) - \$175 (September) - \$175 (February)
2. **Eight installments:** \$200 (at time of registration) – \$50 (August) - \$50 (September) - \$50 (October) - \$50 (November) - \$50 (January) - \$50 (February) - \$50 (March).

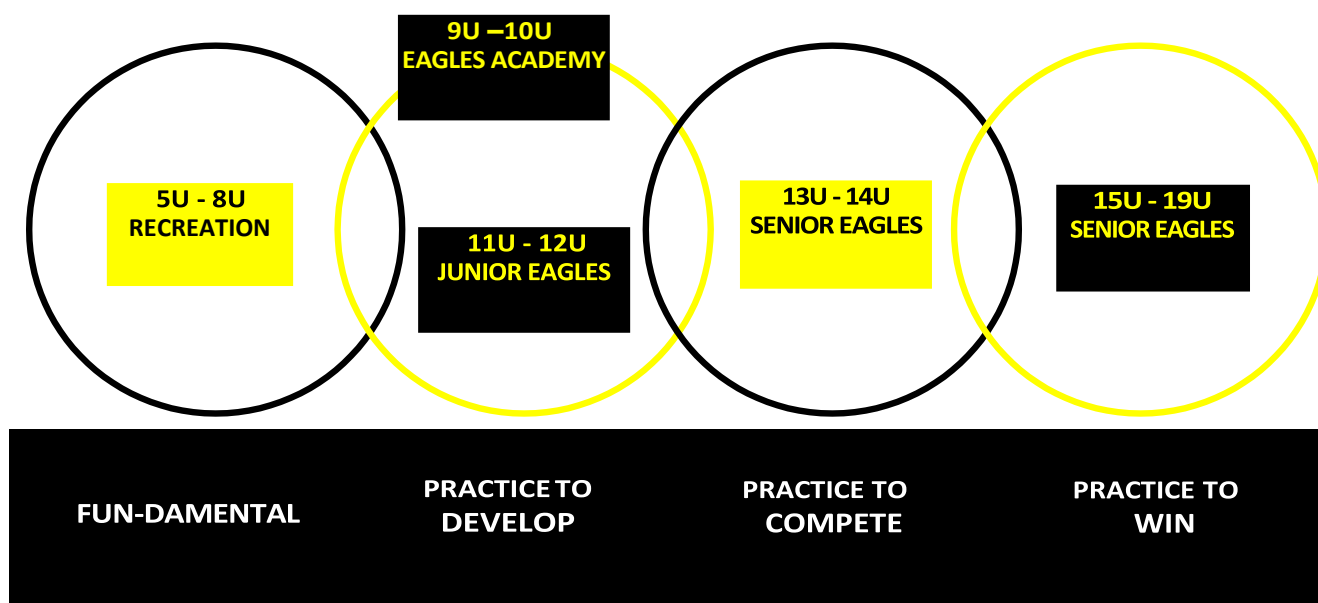
### COACHING PHILOSOPHY & METHODOLOGY
