Eagles Coaches Code of Conduct

This code of conduct is to ensure soccer can be enjoyed in a safe, positive environment. We have a responsibility to promote high standards of behavior around the game of soccer as well as provide an opportunity for every child to achieve their potential. Please play your part.

- 1. Place the well-being, safety and enjoyment of each player above everything
- 2. Comply with US Soccer and CSC guidelines related to player safety especially:
 - ✓ Concussion
 - ✓ Goal safety
 - ✓ Heat related illness
 - ✓ Correct equipment
- 3. Show respect to all involved in the game: colleagues, officials, opponents and spectators
- 4. Never engage in or tolerate, offensive, insulting or abusive language or behavior
- 5. Obey the rules and policies of Calcasieu Soccer Club & Louisiana Soccer Association
- 6. Adhere to the laws and spirit of the game
- 7. Promote fair play and high standards of behavior
- 8. Represent CSC in a professional manner at all times
- 9. Co-operate fully with others for the best interests of all teams & players
- 10. Be a positive role model for players, their parents and other spectators
- 11. Never tolerate any form of bullying or behavior that could be considered abusive
- 12. Never engage in any behavior that could be considered abusive or bullying
- 13. Develop mutual trust and respect with every player to build their self-esteem
- 14. Set team goals and objectives for the season
- 15. Teach sound skills & tactics in a structured, organized, positive manner
- 16. Provide constructive feedback and evaluations to players Fall & Spring
- 17. Be punctual and reliable for all team related events and activities
- 18. Strive to continually educate yourself about the game of soccer
- 19. Ensure each player wears the appropriate CSC attire and equipment
- 20. Wear the appropriate CSC coaching attire at practice and games

Failure to follow this code of conduct may result in the following:

- Required to meet with the club board or a club director
- Monitored by the Director of Coaching
- Suspended or fined by the club

Eagles Practice Session Guidelines

Following these guidelines can create a productive coaching environment and help coaches to have a more positive coaching experience.

- Arrive at practice with a plan and an objective.
- Be able to communicate the objectives of practice sessions to players and make your teachable moments clear and relevant to the practice session objectives.
- Design practice sessions that keep everyone, including goalies, involved all the time. Avoid activities with long lines of players standing around.
- Require your goalie to attend the Eagles Goalkeeper sessions.
- Set a target for each player to get a minimum of 300 touches each and try to achieve this in the first 20 minutes through ball skills and/or rondos.
- Include activities that simulate real game conditions and have a direct correlation to actual game situations.
- Restrict activities to set periods of time or target scores to create a competitive environment and avoid boredom.
- Use small sided games as often as possible to ensure maximum touches on the ball. Avoid playing long practice games or scrimmages just for the sake of it.
- Design game related fitness activities involving the ball as often as possible. Avoid complex laps where players jog at a pace that has no relevance to the game and takes away from critical ball time.
- Bring players together at the end of each practice to briefly review and reinforce.
- Find creative ways to make practice fun for your players.
